
MLKTA DLI TEACHERS and Students "Getting Busy"





Jemina Jones, Spanish Language Arts

Students are continuing to work on Communication, Culture and Connection to World Language State Standards. Students are also having the opportunity to engage in collaborative tasks based on research based pedagogical (Art of Teaching) strategies. Prior to what is pictured, students worked in cooperative groups of three where each group focused on a different country (not necessarily all Spanish speaking). Students explored all the geo and political structures of their selected region, put together a report/essay and created a slide deck for their oral presentations. Students have also been reading "En el tiempo de las mariposas," a twelve chapter novel by Julia Alvarez. The reading and analysis of this novel builds on the prior learning focuses mentioned prior. Ms. Jones also exposed students to a visual version where they were able to more effectively comprehend the content. Ms. Jones taught how to properly use graphic organizers such as Venn Diagrams and T Charts to note similarities and differences between the novel and film. This is meaningful instruction and learning occurring for our DLI students in their Spanish class.







Sarah Gilliken, English Language Arts

Students are reading the classic novel, "The Outsiders." Ms. Gilliken's long-term and short-term objectives are to build community in the classroom, pique students interest in reading while developing their vocabulary skills. This is a vital skill set for students to develop considering DLI students' long-term goal is for them to obtain the Seal of Biliteracy, which is one of three pillars of the DLI program. Ms. Gilliken, who is also the Department Chair for our English Language Arts department, facilitates opportunities for students to build their stamina for the Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium (SBAC) test. In the midst of these instructional and learning activities, students are also improving in their reading fluency and improving in their comprehension skills which these skill sets support their learning across curricular areas. Similar to what is occurring in Sra. Jones class, students will also compare elements of the story in multiple forms of media. This is a proven strategy to engage students while building their understanding of the content of the story. Students have also written personal narratives addressing a time where they felt proud of themselves. Instruction and learning activities pertinent to reading and writing align with Common Core Curriculum Standards. All in all, these learning opportunities continue to be of great benefit to our students ongoing academic success.







Ramon Castillo Juarez, History (Spanish)

Our DLI teachers designate time to collaborate across curricular areas. In this case, Mr. Castillo is aware that our students are currently reading the novel, "En el tiempo de las mariposas" with Sra. Jones in their Spanish class. The content of this story is about the Mirabal sisters' experiences during the reign of the brutal dictator of Rafael Trujillo. To better facilitate their understanding of the historical context, Mr. Castillo reviewed with students how Trujillo attained and maintained authority over the island nation. This was accomplished by comparing and contrasting Trujillo's rule to that of absolutist kings in medieval Europe. Each student was responsible for creating their own individual T-chart. Again, this validates that students are learning valuable skill sets that are reinforced and applied across subject areas. This learning activity was especially significant because students made it clear that THEY wanted to learn more about dictators and resistance to oppression. In the coming weeks, students will be completing the last facets of the 7th grade standards and be able to move on to other ideas and concepts. Mr. Castillo expressed that due to students' interest in dictators and revolutions, he is planning on using the last few months of school to focus on Latin American revolutions. This is the definition of Culturally Responsive and Relevant Instruction that engages our students and provides

information that they can relate to.




MLKTA Awards Assembly/SBAC Rally
